PRESENTATION: UNIVERSAL DEIGN FOR LEARNING

Universal Design for Learning is a framework that guides the design of instructional goals, assessments, methods, and materials to optimize learning for all students. The UDL Guidelines are a tool used to implement Universal Design for Learning in the educational environment by offering a set of concrete suggestions that can be applied to any academic area to ensure that meaningful, challenging learning opportunities are accessible to all learners. The goal is to remove barriers within the classroom for all learners and to give them access to the necessary framework:

- The why of learning (engage them)
- The what of learning (representation)
- The how of learning (action and expression)

Erin can customize district specific training and offers coaching for individual groups or teachers.
